WHAT HAS CHANGED IN THE LAW?

- Starting in 2016, all precincts must register any citizen who is not already registered on Election Day.
- Therefore, we must have one election judge in each precinct whose sole duty is to register those who come into the precinct on Election Day.



HOW ARE WE GOING TO DO THIS?

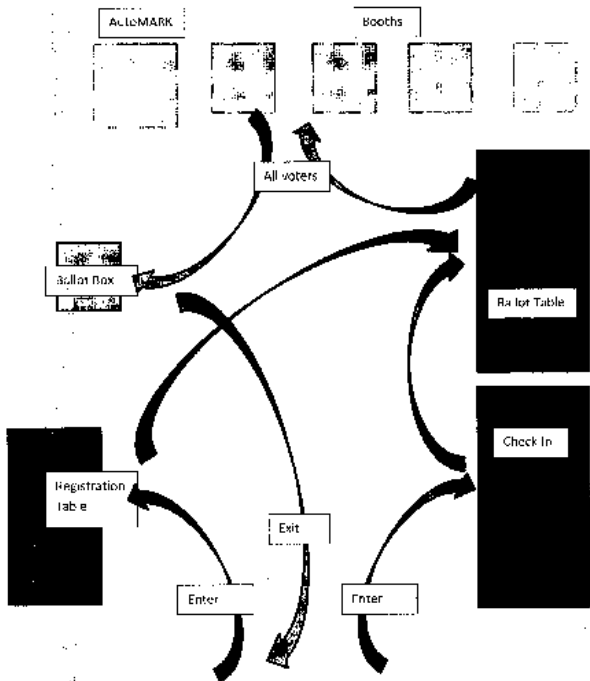
- One judge in each precinct will be assigned as the “Registration Judge”.
- Forms will be provided to each registration judge as well as instructions.
- They will receive additional training prior to the election so they are comfortable in knowing their duties.
- Pay will be the exact same as all other judges.



WHAT PROCEDURES ARE WE GOING TO DO DIFFERENTLY IN THE MARCH 2016 ELECTION?

- There will be “Tech Judges” whose sole responsibility will be the computer
- They will be in charge of checking all voters in on Election Day.
- Each “Tech Judge” will be required to come into the office for about 30 minutes before the election to practice and allow for any questions to be answered.

- No, because it is a one-step whole page application - a completely different form, that will be placed on a different spindle you will get when you pick up your coordinator materials (we made them after the other stuff for judges was already packed in ballot boxes).
- The ballot judge will put on the spindle number and initial it, but nothing else is needed.
- If the ballot is spoiled or the voter needs assistance, the ballot judge can mark appropriately on the ballot application (top half) portion of form.
